2. NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING AND PROXY STATEMENT:

This is an official announcement of the 2024 SNC Annual Meeting of Shareholders, which explains the purpose of the meeting. The Proxy Statement explains the issues that are expected to come before the shareholders at the Annual Meeting and instructions for completing and returning your signed Proxy or an online Proxy prior to the Annual Meeting.

3. SNC PROXY:

Shareholders will receive a paper Proxy as well as an electronic PIN to vote online instead of by mail. By submitting your Proxy online through SNC's online voting portal at sncvote.org, you'll be eligible for online voting proxy prizes!

4. SNC TRUST REPORT

This report details the financial activities of the SNC Trust for FY 2023.

4. RETURN ENVELOPE:

The postage-paid envelope to be used to return your paper proxy.

The 2024 Annual Meeting of Shareholders is scheduled for Saturday, June 22, 2024, at 10:00 a.m., at the Changepoint Church in Anchorage, Alaska. SNC will provide more details about the Annual Meeting in proxy materials which will be mailed out in mid-May.

The meeting will be held for the purpose of electing four directors to three-year terms ending in 2027, as well as reviewing the corporation's performance for FY2023.

CREATE/ UPDATE YOUR STOCK WILL

A Stock Will is a legal document that states a person's wishes concerning the disposal of property, such as ANCSA stock, after death. Stock Wills are important because they ensure a person's last wishes are known and honored. A Stock Will should be updated to reflect life changes, such as a marriage, divorce, additional family members, or death of an heir.

A current Stock Will on file with SNC, or other Alaska Native Corporations, makes certain that stock is inherited by the people the shareholder chooses. In addition, SNC holds a monetary drawing twice a year for those who have updated Wills on file. Drawings are held in the following months:

snc homesite program resumes with

ENHANCED POLICY CHANGES

SNC has reopened the Shareholder Homesite program with significant policy enhancements aimed at providing shareholders with more opportunities to secure homesites and build their homes. After a temporary pause to work on policy changes, the SNC Land Department has resumed accepting applications from shareholders interested in participating in the program.

The updated policy changes are designed to offer greater flexibility and support for shareholders looking to establish homesites on SNC lands. Some of the key policy adjustments include:

Increased Lease Terms:

Lease terms for homesites have been extended from 40 to 50 years, providing shareholders with a longer-term commitment and security. Shareholders will now have more time to build their homes on SNC lands, expanding their ability to access resources for home construction.

Extended Build Timeline:

The timeline for shareholders to build their homes on their sites has been extended from 3 to 5 years, allowing for more flexibility in planning and construction.

inupiaq advisory council collaborates on

HBO 'TRUE DETECTIVE: NIGHT COUNTRY'

The HBO series "True Detective: Night Country" features a fictional town in Alaska called Ennis, with filming primarily done in Iceland and some scenes shot around Nome. SNC Shareholder, Marjorie Kunaq Tahbone, a member of the Iñupiaq Advisory Council, worked with the show to ensure an accurate representation of the Nome-like setting.

The producers aimed to authentically depict a place like Nome and consulted locals, including the Iñupiaq Advisory Council, for insights and feedback. Tahbone and the council reviewed scripts for all six episodes featuring Ennis, providing input on scenes and lines that seemed inaccurate or questionable.

One notable change involved a scene featuring caribou, originally scripted with elk, which was corrected due to the absence of elk in Alaska, especially in the Arctic. The council also advocated for the inclusion of Iñupiaq words and the incorporation of traditional Alaska Native stories, assisting in selecting Iñupiaq names for characters.

Additionally, the council recommended trigger warnings for episodes related to the Missing and Murdered Indigenous People epidemic. They advised on maintaining the integrity of the story while preserving cultural authenticity, ensuring that non-local audiences could understand the context.

Tahbone, a traditional Inuit tattoo artist, contributed to designing tattoos featured in the series. The show represents a blend of cultures, including input from Arctic communities like Greenland and Canada.

Tahbone expressed satisfaction with her role in the advisory council, emphasizing the importance of accurate and respectful content. She hopes this experience will create more opportunities for Indigenous people in the film industry. The fourth season premiered on Jan. 14, with new episodes released weekly.



ANCSA: ORIGINAL SHAREHOLDER ENROLLMENT (1971-1991)

Each Alaska Native regional and village corporation had to enroll shareholders within two years from the date that ANCSA was signed into law. This was no small task; Alaska Native people were spread across vast distances in every region, often with no roads connecting homes and communities. When the two-year deadline arrived, the twelve Alaska Native regional corporations had enrolled just over 64,000 original shareholders, each of whom received 100 shares.

The original language in ANCSA defined the eligibility requirements for enrollment in an Alaska Native corporation. In particular, two requirements of original shareholder eligibility are noteworthy: blood quantum and date of birth. ANCSA defined native as a citizen of the United States who is a person of one-fourth degree or more Alaska Indian (including Tsimshian Indians not enrolled in the Metlakatla Indian Community) Eskimo, or Aleut blood, or a combination thereof. Meaning, only Alaska Native people of blood quantum were eligible to be enrolled in an Alaska Native corporation (regional or village). Only those Alaska Native people of one-fourth blood quantum who were born on or before 11:59 p.m. on December 18, 1971, were eligible to enroll in Alaska Native regional and village corporations.
